In view of the now well-known fact' that the English sentence has decreased in average length at least one-half in three hundred years, the question arises whether the length of the paragraph has decreased, increased, or remained stationary. Setting aside for the present the O. E. and the M. E. paragraph as inorganic, we make a count of the average number of words to the sentence and to the paragraph, in representative authors since the middle of the fifteenth century. Considerations of time compel us to choose between counting a large number of paragraphs in a few writers, or a smaller number in a considerable list.
